

## Church Campus Landmarks

The **Flags** in our parking lot serve as symbols of a people, a region, and a way of life. We are commissioned by these symbols (Acts 1:8) each time we enter and depart our campus. As “*faith partners in God’s world*,” we are citizens in the Kingdom of God by how we live faithfully in Metro-Louisville, the Commonwealth of Kentucky, the United States of America, and around the world.

### **Sanctuary Windows**

- Creation (left side)...This window pictures a dramatic interpretation of the creation narratives in the book of Genesis.
- Redemption (center)...This window is rich in symbols interpreting God’s work in redeeming man and woman through Christ.
- Spirit at Work in the World (right side)...In this window, God’s Holy Spirit, represented by the dove, empowers each of us as Christians to be ministers of the gospel at work, in our homes, and through the life of our church.

A **Meditation-Memorial Garden**, located in the courtyard area nearest the Creation Window, is a dedicated outdoor area where we can pray and renew ourselves in God’s creatorship.

**Flags of the Nations Walkway** is a display of international flags representing countries where missionaries, with a connection to St. Matthews Baptist Church, are currently serving and sharing the gospel globally.

**The Last Supper Painting**, which hangs on the front wall of our Chapel, is a mural reproduction of Leonardo da Vinci’s “Last Supper.” It was painted from 1910-1912 by Guido “Guy” Leber, while on location with the original in Milan, Italy and donated to our church by his descendents to be displayed in a spiritual setting. This amazing artwork of Christianity’s most famous painting is a permanent ministry exhibit for our church to share with the world.
